You can also decide at the matter level whether to automatically pay an invoice from Trust. Choose the matter and click on the Trust tab on the far right. Click on the name of the Trust account you have associated with that matter or create a new Trust. In the dialog box that appears, check or uncheck the box that says "Auto Pay Invoices from this Trust?" based on your needs.

Lastly, on your invoices, you will now see a matter summary section that reflects the status of your Trust account, credits, balance due, etc. If you include the Statement of Account page on your invoices, the matter summary will appear whether you have matter details such as transactions, open invoices and credits turned on or off.
